

Who can apply?

Juniors (after midterms) and Seniors (beginning of the year)

How are students notified?

Students are <u>invited</u> to apply via email. For juniors, students are notified via email late March/early April. For seniors, students are notified mid September.



- Scholarship Overall weighted 90 GPA (5 semesters in total for junior applicants; 6 semesters for senior applicants)
- Character faculty committee reviews character requirements
- <u>Leadership</u> student is engaged in their community
- <u>Service</u> student volunteers time in their community

Application Requirements:

- Faculty Recommendation Statement (faculty emails directly to advisors)
- **Personal Statement** (250-300 words)
- Resume
- Good Character Pledge and Parent Acknowledgement (e-signatures)
- **A faculty committee then reviews all applicants for character, leadership, and service.

Application deadline:

- There is a mandatory meeting in February to review the application components. **The application is due in March** and submitted to the google classroom "NHS Application". Juniors are notified of acceptance in April.
- If juniors don't meet the eligibility requirements, they have an opportunity to reapply in the beginning of senior year as long as their <u>GPA</u> is above 90. In this case, **seniors are required to submit their application late September**. They will be notified of acceptance in early October and required to attend the ceremony mid-October.

Ceremony: Early May for juniors. Mid-October for seniors.

Who can apply?

Juniors and seniors

How are students notified?

Students are <u>invited</u> to apply and <u>emailed</u> a letter of eligibility with the application.



Eligibility Criteria (point scale):

- Completed a minimum of 3 years of HS regents classes
- Be **enrolled in a fourth year of science** (IB, Anatomy/Physiology, Physics)
- Unweighted 90 GPA in science
- Unweighted 85 GPA overall
- Participation in science related activities/programs

Application Requirements:

- **Application** General Information
- Extracurricular activities
- Personal statement 250-300 words about the impact you will make as a member
- Three (3) faculty recommendation forms (at least 2 from science)
- Eligible science related activities/programs

Application Deadline: Early October of junior year. Submit stapled application to Mr. Weiss.

Ceremony: Induction takes place late October in junior year.

Who can apply?

Freshmans, Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors



How are students notified?

<u>Students apply on their own.</u> In September, announcements are made, flyers are posted in the hallways, and postings are made to the art Google Classrooms. Students are notified in art classes, as well.

Timeline:

- September: Announcements made flyers in halls, postings to art GC
- October: Application/reapplication students must reapply EACH year
- November: **Start Memory Project** there's a \$15 participation fee can be waived
- December: Submit entry to Scholastic Art and Writing Awards
- January Hand in artwork for induction ceremony
- February Memory project due

Eligibility Criteria:

- Must have completed 1 credit of high school art (Studio Art counts!)
- Maintain **85 average in art classes**
- Enter at least one work of art to the Scholastic Art Awards Competition (\$10.00 payable through website fee waiver available)
- Complete an art service project:
 - **Memory Project**: Portrait or Identity Art [\$15.00 contribution this will not prevent you from participating], OR
 - Six art-related service hours to the school/community
- Choose an **art teacher as a mentor** of your art for Scholastic Awards
- Pay \$5.00 NAHS dues
- Create/submit original work of art for the April Induction Ceremony by January

Application Deadline:

October of each school year (must reapply each year - \$5.00 annual membership)

Ceremony: Induction takes place in April.

Dues: Yes - \$5.00 national due for application and \$15.00 participation fee for Memory Project (can be reduced or eliminated if students fundraise). Total - \$20.00

Who can apply?

Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors

How are students notified?

Students apply on their own. Students are notified by the teacher/advisor in theatre classes, musical/drama productions and the Drama Guild. There are also postings made on Google Classroom for all theatre classes and the Drama Guild in the beginning of the year.



Eligibility Criteria:

 Students must achieve a <u>minimum 10 points</u> through the system established by the Educational Theatre Association. Points are awarded through participation in a theatre class, Drama Guild and/or production (on or off stage).

Application Requirements:

- Complete the **Point Form**

Application Deadline:

Once students meet the requirements and submit the point form to the advisor, they receive an electronic invitation from the advisor for the induction ceremony.

Ceremony: Induction takes place in the fall or spring – this date changes year to year.

Dues: \$35 (one time initiation fee - lifetime membership)



How are students notified?

Eligible students are <u>invited</u> to apply. Letters are <u>mailed home</u> in the beginning/middle of October



Eligibility Criteria:

- Unweighted 90 GPA in math
- Weighted 85 GPA overall
- Completed 3 years of high school/college math
- Enrolled in a high school math course at the time of application

Application Requirements:

- Write an essay "Who is the person that has the greatest impact on me in mathematics?" You can write about a teacher, friend, relative - anyone who has positively influenced you in mathematics.
- Math Teacher Recommendation

Application Deadline: Early November

Ceremony: Induction takes place end of November

How are students notified?

<u>Students apply on their own</u>. Postings made in Google Classroom and announcements in every music class. Application link (google form) is posted in every music google classroom and there is a QR code posted on the Tri-M Bulletin Board.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Be enrolled in at least one performance ensemble/ music class each year
- Unweighted 90 GPA in music
- Weighted 85 GPA overall
- Continued character strength that includes service, leadership and cooperation
- Service requirement: complete a minimum of **2 music service events.** This can include Lobby Live, Concert Candy Sales, Music Tutoring, etc.

Application Requirements:

- Students must submit a google form application and respond to the following question: How has music impacted your life? What do you think you can contribute to the Tri-M Music Honor Society?

Application Deadline: Due middle/late September (acceptance letter will be emailed)
