Budget Presentation: (Mayda Kramer, Chris Pellettieri, Liz Dion) 0.57% increase to tax levy. Solicited questions about budget. Q: What is health insurance premium impact? A: negotiated with bargaining units to increase their participation. The district is lower this year. Q:Why aren't PILOT programs revenues on a separate line in the budget and with local reserves? A: Pellettierino one asked for it to be separate; Dion-it's broken out online. Payment In Lieu Of Taxes- real estate developer tax breaks, lower than assessed valuations. Increases over 15 years until tax assessment is at valuation. Q: Can there be a community meeting on this? A: Dion-it's online in a Powerpoint on the main page of the website. RVC has little say in PILOTS. RVCDOE is asking Town of Hempstead, Santino's office, to allow schools to have input in granting PILOTS in the future. IDA board makes thee decision. Hempstead Town says development is good for community.

Budget Vote is May16th, 7:00am-9:00pm. Absentee ballots, applications on RVCSchools.org. Application requires original signature Send to children in college. Can by done by mail and returned by May16th. Election includes school budget vote, library budget vote, and 2 BOE seats. There are 5 candidates for the 2 open BOE seats. IB/AP distinctions and costs questioned. US News & World Report rated SSHS low because IB did not submit information to the magazine and magazine only considered AP. IB schools can only be Bronz or Silver rated in have some AP classes, therefore SSHS is Silver rated. L. Dion defended IB as it creates a learner across all subjects and includes a community service component. Ranking was an IB issue, not a quality of RVC education issue.. Two years ago RVC didn't make "the list" either based on algebra scores in 9th grade and changes in US News & World Report methodology. Q: Should we try to opt out of rankings? A: Pellettieri- working to find out why IB didn't submit data. L. Dion- try not to focus on rankings. Q: There are rumors that ratings are down due to high opt out? A: Pellettieri- absolutely not. Maya Kramer not seeking reelection to school board, praised people who work for the district. Q: Is is appropriate for BOE to write editorial "Why We Don't Care About Rankings?" A: Dr. Johnson has a letter on the website and BOE is considering a letter.

Motion to Accept Budget: Made by Donna Downing; seconded by Faith Varley. Unanimously approved.

Treasurer's Report: (K. Garrett) \$31,834 was balance at the end of March. Outstanding check for \$956.86. Challenge day billows \$8181 when \$6,000 was budgeted. Overage came from a rope trip with BOCES. Didn't receive BOCES credit since didn't do activity last year. \$12,048 with half paid by BOCES and half paid by PTA. Last year district paid for the rope trip.
