Communication with parents

- 1. SSMS website has an MYP tab with policy guides, resources and updates on the programme.
- 2. All MYP rubrics are available on google classroom
- 3. This year, MYP scores are communicated to parents via Powerschools.
 - Teachers create a column for the "traditional" assessment score
 - A separate column reflects the "MYP score" out of 8 points
 - The MYP score emphasizes student progress and development in each criteria
